- The Mayor thanked Council for their work in 2022 and promised another busy year for 2023.
- Sewer, Sanitary and Storm Sewer should be finished in 2023 for the Broadway and New York project. Paving is expected to begin in 2024.
- Waterlines and Paving will go as the budget allows.
- A General Mills Hometown Grant in the amount of \$60,000 was secured for a fitness park.
