ORDINANCE NO. 2023-65

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND AMENDING THE CITY OF WELLSTON'S CODIFIED ORDINANCE SECTION 33.10 REGARDING THE RECOVERY FEE SCHEDULE WITHIN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Wellston has published certain general and permanent ordinances in a volume of Codified Ordinances including Section 33.10 regarding the hazmat cost recovery fee schedule for the Wellston Fire Department; and


WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Wellston has determined it necessary to revise Section 33.10 of the City's Codified Ordinances regarding fees charged to reflect the increase in costs since the fees were last established; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE CITY OF WELLSTON, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That section 33.10 of the codified ordinances of the City of Wellston be amended as set forth in exhibit "A", attached hereto, with those underlined portions showing the amendments to the original language and that it be placed within the Wellston City code, in regular text.



EXHIBIT A

§ 33.10 HAZMAT COST RECOVERY FEE SCHEDULE.

The city hereby approves the following fee schedule that will be used by the city's Division of Fire for the purpose of cost recovery, and charged to the person liable for the services used:

- (A) Aerial/rescue: \$100/hour
- (B) Apparatus: \$100/hour;
- (C) Fire report: \$6/hour;
- (D) Firefighter: \$10/hour;
- (E) Hazmat operations: \$15/hour;
- (F) Investigative report: \$25/hour;
- (G) Hazmat technician: \$20/hour;
- (H) Water rescue unit: \$200/hour; and
- (I) Wildland unit: \$100/hour.

(A) <u>Apparatus</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$200.00</u>
(B) <u>Wildland Unit</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$200.00</u>
(C) <u>Aerial/Rescue</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$400.00</u>
(D) <u>Water Rescue/Hazmat Unit</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$300.00</u>
(E) <u>Firefighter</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$15.00</u>
(F) <u>Water/Hazmat Operations</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$20.00</u>
(G) <u>Water/Hazmat Technicians</u>	<u>Per Hour / Unit</u>	<u>\$30.00</u>
(H) <u>Fire Report</u>	<u>N/A</u>	<u>\$6.00</u>
(I) <u>Investigative Report</u>	<u>N/A</u>	<u>\$25.00</u>

All other supplies and equipment will be invoiced on direct cost and replacement costs. Supplies will also be based on complete unit replacement, example ½ case of absorbent pads will be invoiced as full case.
