

## **ORDINANCE NO. 2025-37**

## AN ORDINANCE FOR THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE 101 POLICE OTHER (MISC.) FUND TO THE PRISONER HOUSING FUND AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WELLSTON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

**Section 1:** The transfer is as follows:

<u>Section 2.</u> This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Wellston, Ohio as the additional appropriation is necessary to make a timely payment for the Wellston Police Department. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

Section 3. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that the deliberations of this Council that resulted in such formal actions were in a meeting open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.23 of the Ohio Revised Code.
